As a ministry, KGF aims to: equip intercessors worldwide to pray effectively, equip young people to have a passion for prayer, raise awareness of the spiritual realities that govern our nations, train men and women to engage in spiritual warfare that yields tangible results, and re-establish the Kingdom of God as the first and final authority in our world. As a ministry, we aim to provide a platform where prayer is central in the life of a believer.

OUR MISSION



Our mission is to cultivate a global culture of prayer by hosting international conferences that focus on intercession. We organise interactive workshops and training sessions to deepen understanding and effectiveness in prayer, equipping believers for impactful intercession. Young Warriors

In 2025, we had 23 of our Young warriors graduating. The Young warriors participated in interactive lessons on prayer, and the Teen Warriors engaged in one-on-one sessions to allow for a more personalised learning programme. Highlights for Young Warriors included consistent participation from 19 children throughout the year, showing growth in their understanding of Biblical principles and prayer, culminating in an official graduation at the 15th Anniversary KGF Conference.

For Teen Warriors, the one-on-one approach allowed the Teen Warrior teachers to gain deeper insight into each teen's struggles and strengths, fostering their growth.

A meaningful event took place on 7 June 2025 when KGF and GRC Sunday School hosted the second Fast and Prayer Day for the Friends of Jesus under the theme "*God heard the boy (Genesis 21:17-20).*" The day focused on helping the children learn how to speak to Jesus personally through prayer. Approximately 50 children attended, demonstrating admirable strength and commitment as they participated in fasting, worship and prayer. The day was spiritually enriching, building their confidence in both prayer and fasting, and concluded with refreshments and fellowship.

The Young and Teen Warriors' understanding of prayer was powerfully expressed through a dramatic illustration at the 15th Anniversary KGF Conference. The illustration depicted the challenges of social media and peer pressure facing their generation. Through this presentation, they conveyed the message that intercession brings transformation. They were reminded that nothing they encounter is beyond God's power to turn around and were shown how, as young intercessors, they can engage heaven in earthly matters.

2025 Overview

PRAYER CONFERENCE JOHANNESBURG

On 26 July 2025, KGF Johannesburg hosted a Prayer Conference under the theme "*Influencing the Affairs of Man Through Prayer*", grounded on James 5:17–18. The session was led by Pastor Khongelani Chauke and attended by 72 people.

The conference was marked by a tangible sense of God's presence and a strong emphasis on empowering intercessors to pray effectively—prayers that produce impactful results and influence lives. Pastor Khongelani spoke in detail on the responsibility of intercessors to engage in prayer that is both fervent and aligned with God's will, reinforcing the Biblical principle that earnest prayer carries transformative power.

The level of engagement was high. There was active contribution during the question-and-answer session, demonstrating both spiritual hunger and a desire for deeper understanding.

One of the challenges encountered was time management. The extended question-and-answer segment reduced the allocated time for corporate prayer. Additionally, attendance consisted primarily of Riverside Christian Church (RCC) members, indicating an opportunity for broader outreach in future events. Promotional efforts were also affected by delays in poster circulation due to misunderstandings regarding distribution channels.

The conference had a meaningful impact on attendees. The testimonies indicated that participants felt empowered with a clearer understanding of intercession and were challenged to cultivate consistency in their prayer lives. Several attendees expressed renewed encouragement to attend the 15th Anniversary Annual Conference, having gained insight into the impartation of the spirit of prayer that characterises KGF conferences and workshops. Overall, attendees left with a deeper appreciation of the power and necessity of intercession in influencing the affairs of individuals, communities, and nations.

JOHANNESBURG PRAYER CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS



2025 Overview

BELLVILLE PRAYER AND INTERCESSION WORKSHOP

On 16 August 2025, KGF Bellville hosted a Prayer & Intercession Workshop focused on the theme "*Understanding Intercession.*" The session was led by Pastor Emmanuel Kongolo from Jesus To All Languages (JTL) Ministries Cape Town. The workshop aimed to equip intercessors with a deeper spiritual understanding of their role and to strengthen their effectiveness in prayer ministry.

A total of 112 people attended. The workshop created a meaningful space for learning, reflection, and spiritual growth. One of the key highlights of the workshop was an in-depth explanation of the spiritual system and how it functions according to God's principles. Attendees gained clarity on the biblical foundation of intercession and the importance of aligning one's prayers with God's will.

The teaching also emphasised the qualities that define an effective intercession including patience, steadfast faith and being firmly anchored in God's Word. Practical guidance was provided to help attendees to cultivate these characteristics in their daily walk. In addition, the workshop addressed common spiritual challenges faced by intercessors, particularly discouragement and doubt, and encouraged intercessors to remain spiritually vigilant, resilient and strengthened through prayer.

The prayer workshop had a positive and lasting impact on those who attended. Attendees testified of a deeper understanding of intercession, renewed faith and practical spiritual tools to apply in their ministries. Many left feeling encouraged, spiritually refreshed and better prepared to stand firm in prayer despite the challenges they may face. The event successfully strengthened the intercessory community and reinforced their vital role within the church.

2025 Overview

CAPE TOWN 15th ANNIVERSARY ANNUAL CONFERENCE

From 26 to 30 November 2025, KGF commemorated a significant milestone with its 15th Anniversary Annual Conference hosted in Observatory, Cape Town. Held under the theme "*Accessing a Higher Realm of Intercession*", the conference served both as a celebration of God's faithfulness over the past fifteen years and as a time of spiritual equipping, empowering intercessors to grow in effectiveness and depth in prayer. The gathering was led by Bishop Ghislain Lunkunku and Bishop Tshalo Katshunga, whose teachings guided attendees through a rich and transformative journey of intercession. The conference drew an attendance of 1168 participants in person and 423 joining online over the five days. From the outset, the atmosphere was marked by expectancy, worship, and a shared hunger to encounter God more deeply.

On the opening day, Bishop Tshalo laid a strong Biblical foundation by teaching on Accessing a Higher Realm of Intercession, drawing from the account of Abraham interceding for Sodom and Gomorrah in Genesis 18. His message framed intercession not merely as a practice, but as a journey of intimacy and alignment with God's will. Building on this theme on the second day, Bishop Tshalo explored the power of intercession and the pathway to deeper levels of prayer, emphasising that true intercession flows from surrender and partnership with God rather than attempts to persuade or control Him. Attendees were encouraged by the reminder that the earnest prayer of a righteous person carries great power and produces meaningful results.

The final three days were led by Bishop Ghislain, who focused on equipping intercessors to stand firmly for every promise and purpose of God. His teachings highlighted the role of spiritual warfare within intercession, underscoring how God uses life's challenges to shape the character and resilience of those called to pray.

CAPE TOWN 15th ANNIVERSARY ANNUAL CONFERENCE

Participants were reminded that intercession is not limited to a select few but is the responsibility of every believer, regardless of ministry role. Through faith-filled prayer, even seemingly impossible obstacles can be overcome, demonstrating God's sovereignty and control in every circumstance. Bishop Ghislain also gave a prophetic word of knowledge of KGF's mission expanding to build a School of Prayer where people worldwide will come to learn and better understand how heaven is engaged in earthly matters through intercession.

Throughout the five days, the conference was characterised by a powerful and prayerful atmosphere. Attendees were invited into moments of reflection, worship, and focused intercession creating space to draw nearer to God and deepen their understanding of their calling. By the close of the conference, many left spiritually refreshed, strengthened, and better equipped to access higher realms of intercession in their personal lives and ministries.

Testimony

Greetings, saints of God, I write this testimony to share how Keepers of God's Fortresses (KGF) has impacted my life. I joined KGF in 2019 as both a financial partner and an intercessor. Being part of the intercession team was a great opportunity that gave me a strong sense of belonging.



In November 2019, during the KGF Annual Prayer Conference, Pastor Tracy Nyamuda prophesied that “all sickness, pain, and disease in my life were not natural and that God was changing all of this.” My responsibility was to pray. During this period, God led me to speak to Pastor Beatrice Katshunga regarding the prophecy I had received.

Pastor Beatrice prayed a prayer of deliverance that began with a powerful declaration: “Enough is enough.” I believe that when God gave me this word through Pastor Tracy, He had already ushered me into a new season of healing. Following the prophecy and Pastor Beatrice’s prayer, there was a shift in my heart and spirit. This shift came in the form of an uncontrollable fire burning in my chest, compelling me to confess and repent of my iniquity.

The Bible says, “For God is not an indifferent bystander. He’s actively cleaning house, torching all that needs to burn, and He won’t quit until it’s all cleansed. God himself is Fire!” (Hebrews 12:28–29, MSG).

The fire of God came to cleanse me from serving Him without full obedience and righteousness. Immediately after confessing and repenting with Pastor Beatrice, the burning sensation disappeared. I then made the decision to step down as an intercessor. At that point, I realised that I did not know who I truly was. I felt confused and lost, and even concluded that I was not an intercessor.

I did not understand why God took away what I loved. My awakening came when Bishop Tshalo Katshunga affirmed that I am an intercessor and that all I needed was a transformative miracle. After hearing this, my focus was restored, and I began pursuing that miracle. I did not know what form it would take, but I believed I would receive it.

Testimony

God answered me during the KGF 2024 Annual Prayer Conference, where I received my life-changing miracle and an impartation for intercessory prayer from Bishop Aloysious Kiiza. The changes include:

- a. A renewed fire and zeal for prayer and intercession.
- b. The ability to fast and pray diligently despite being diabetic.
- c. Consistent and disciplined prayer times, with the Holy Spirit as my Help and Guide.
- d. Greater obedience and purity. God has standards, and I am learning to steward what He has deposited in my life. When He speaks, He requires my obedience. “Obedience is the first act of service,” He whispered to me.
- e. Deliverance — strongholds have been falling at home, at work, and in my personal life. God has been faithful.
- f. A restored identity in Christ. I am back as a KGF intercessor. I walk in God’s freedom and am no longer bound to toxic cycles of sin and sickness.

In conclusion:

“I’ve been out of step with you for a long time, in the wrong since before I was born. What you’re after is truth from the inside out. Enter me, then; conceive a new, true life.” (Psalm 51:4–6, MSG).

I now have my true life in Christ.

Intercession Report

Throughout 2025, the Keepers of God's Fortresses (KGF) Intercession Team demonstrated commitment and spiritual growth through consistent gatherings and intentional training. The team met a total of 37 times during the year with 14 being in-person meetings and 23 online sessions. Ten intercessors formed part of the team.

A notable highlight was team growth, as one intercessor rejoined after a brief absence. Overall attendance improved compared to the previous year, reflecting increased commitment and stability within the group.

The intercessors met regularly to stand in the gap for nations, families, churches, leaders, and various life circumstances. The gatherings focused not only on petition but also on discerning needs and seeking divine intervention. A powerful testimony that emerged during the year when the team prayed in agreement for two missing children in Goma, Congo. Within 24 hours of prayer, the children were found, strengthening the team's conviction in the power of united intercession. In addition to prayer meetings, the team received structured teaching and training. One of the central themes was *Understanding Jesus as The Ultimate Model for Effective Intercession*. Drawing from Matthew 9:36, 14:14, and 15:32, Pastor Beatrice Katshunga taught on three foundational aspects of intercession: spiritual vision, compassion, and intervention.

The intercessors were encouraged to develop God's perception of situations—moving from merely looking at circumstances to seeing them through spiritual discernment. The danger of spiritual blindness was addressed, referencing Isaiah 59:10, Isaiah 56:10, and Deuteronomy 28:29, highlighting it as a tactic of the enemy. Intercessors were urged to cultivate a lifestyle of prayer and communion with the Holy Spirit to grow in God's character, particularly His compassion.

Compassion was emphasised as a trigger for action in intercession, increasing spiritual sensitivity and aligning the intercessor's heart with God's heart for people. The third aspect, intervention, underscored that effective intercession requires corresponding action. Biblical examples such as Abraham and Nehemiah illustrated God's desire for intimacy, dialogue, and partnership with those who pray.

While the year was marked by growth, challenges were also noted. There was recognition of the need for further training to cultivate greater spiritual revelation and prophetic insight during prayer meetings.

Intercession Report

The impact of the intercession team was evident in the spiritual development of its members. Intercessors reported a deeper understanding of the power of prayer and the importance of standing in the gap for others. Increased spiritual sensitivity was observed, with some members experiencing visions and promptings during meetings. Growth in boldness was also evident, as previously quiet intercessors began praying more confidently and openly. The team was both equipped and strengthened for the work of ministry

TESTIMONY

God answered some questions that I had through Bishop Tshalo Katshunga's teaching during the 2025 15th Anniversary Annual Conference. God showed me in a dream my mother passing away before it happened. We prayed as a family but she still passed on. A similar scenario happened with a friend where we prayed but his child passed on. I asked myself why would God show me things and I don't have the capacity to solve it. The answer came through when Bishop Tshalo was teaching where he said that God's revelation is first and foremost for information and secondly for prayer. That settled my mind and freed me.

Financial Report


FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2026

REVENUES

In the 2026 financial year, Keepers of Gods Fortresses (KGF) was able to raise in excess of R200 000 through donations and to a lesser extent the sale of merchandise. Given this year was KGF's 15th year anniversary and with the desire to celebrate this occasion in a fitting manner, there were intensified efforts to raise more funds than had been done in the past.

As such we managed to achieve an approximate 150% increase in revenues through donations in the current year. This was driven by increased commitments from partners, and once off donations towards the conference which took place in November 2025.

Partnership and donations continue to be the main revenue source for KGF. As such, we are committed to continuously finding more efficient ways in which we can get our partners to honour their commitments to donate to the organisation.

FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2026

EXPENDITURES

2025 was a year of further increased activity for KGF, particularly with the annual flagship conference this year celebrating KGF's 15th year anniversary. KGF expenses continue to increase on a proportional basis to the activity level of the organisation.

The biggest expense line items relate to the annual conference, accounting for approximately 80% of total expenses, this includes travel and accommodation for the various speakers.


